The relocation to the new premise was also a good opportunity to rethink the current design language and to apply principles of Quintiles' global workplace standards.

SLA Tokyo tried to create a Modern Office environment based on the following principles

- Modular layout aligned with the base building architectural grid
- Clear separation between public and private spaces
- Location of closed rooms, meeting rooms and telephone booths along the core wall for natural light distribution into the open office
- Variety of working spaces, equally spread out in the office to give users choice and control over their working environment
- Standardized bench type workstations with flexibility to transform to bigger manager desks or free address system
- Creation of neighborhood centers combining utility spaces and tea points, conveniently located near the workstation areas
- Application of a color palette and graphic films on the wall and floor selected by user's vote

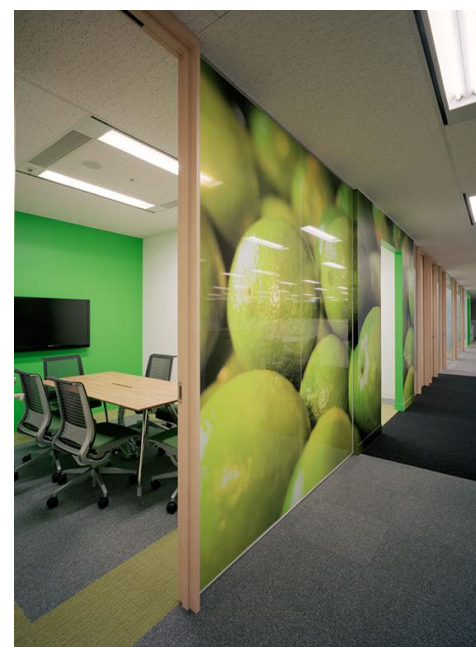
SLA Tokyo substantially redefined with this new regional office the working environment of Quintiles. Hopefully the space will offer flexibility and well-being for staff for many years ahead.
